The commitment of DM Contemporary gallery to present artists from diverse backgrounds who offer unique perspectives and universally appealing themes rings true in the exhibit featuring the paintings of Louise P. Sloane and Carole Freysz. In two concurrent solo exhibitions, the works of these two artists, who live and work on Long Island, mirror the gallery's mission. The themes, techniques and styles of these artists are vastly different, presenting an interesting juxtaposition: the texture and minimalism of Sloane's mixed media work and the colorfully popping patterns and shapes of Gutierrez's paintings. Sloane, born and raised in Queens, and Gutierrez, a native of Switzerland, each bring their own creative visions and interpretations of the world around them to this gallery show, while simultaneously expressing ideas that a broad spectrum of people can relate to on a multitude of levels.
